**TRUSTEES:** Kitchen faucet replaced. Insurance company called by Lucille due to the accident Evelyn Steinis had in parking lot during Auction. Church is covered, but no need for it at this time.


**CHRISTIAN ED:** Vacation Bible School June 25-28, and we are again combining with St. Paul's, First Baptist Church, and Trinity Lutheran. Theme this year is Rolling River Rampage (camping). Around 1885 we have a record of the Christian Endeavor Society, an organization for youth in the church. Each member was expected to attend and participate regularly, and strict regulations were designed to prepare spiritual growth and Christian character. The pastor and committee looked into absences. "Experience Meetings" once a month required members to report on their progress in the Christian life. William Beard, later a missionary to China, was secretary of the organization in 1886.

Here in Huntington, Christian Endeavor was, for a period of time, combined with a Sunday night family prayer and praise service. Mr. Frank Wooster led the singing of old-time gospel hymns, accompanied by Mrs. Eli Baldwin at the organ.

In 1915 the Amity Group formed and met on Friday nights at members' homes. In 1957 the present Pilgrim Fellowship was organized by Rev. Walter Stone and was led by of members of the Yale Divinity School. At present (in 1974) there is a Junior and Senior group; both meet on Sunday nights.
