Church Council Highlights FEBRUARY 2018

MODERATOR: Laura thanked everyone for helping her with her first annual meeting. She inquired if the offices' computer issues were resolved – things are functioning ok.

STEWARDSHIP: Stewardship letters have gone out – dues deadline March 1st - \$12 per confirmed member.

TRUSTEES: We released cleaning ladies and KKS Associates Inc. has been hired and are working out very well. A person accidently ran into Reuman House with her car with some damage knocking down wrought iron railing and slight damage to the house itself. She was not injured. Bob Margolies working on getting Reuman House on Historic Registry to receive a grant.

DIACONATE: Lenten dinner 6pm here on February 28th, service at 7pm. 3 services for Easter—6:30am- sunrise at Jones' Family Farm, 9am & 11am service in our Sanctuary. There is no passing of the peace during flu season. Justine moved to remove 34 inactive members and Sue Lindley seconded. Motion carried. List will be brought to annual meeting next year. March 4th Rabbi Eliana Falk, a native of Shelton, will do a presentation on Passover after a brunch.


