




## LET US NOT FORGET....

## CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS OCTOBER 2017

**NOMINATING:** In pretty good shape. Lynn Ibsen agreed to do Nursery Committee. Only one open position.

**CHRISTIAN ED:** Picnic went very well. Rally Sunday was 9/24 and Sunday School is up and running. Have a new curriculum called All in One Sunday School. Geared for multiple classes in one setting. They ask that any adult who would like to teach a session, please let Jenny or Kirsten know. It is very easy as this program is well-organized and all prepared. No confirmation class this year. Per Rev. Lucille, there will be 4 eligible next year. Fall festival last Sunday in October. They will have games, arts and crafts and refreshments. CE will serve the Spooner House meal for October 13. Pageant idea all ready and dates are set through the end of the year.

Bob Sember asked that Andy send out a report for each committee showing a summary of what was budgeted, what was spent, and how much is left for each category.

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

### (Some historical tidbits about our history in Shelton)

In 1724 Jedidiah Mills was ordained. They paid him "100 acres of land...80 pounds toward his house...40 pounds in money and 40 pounds to work...50 pounds salary a year'. He graduated from Yale in 1722.

Samuel Huntington signed the Declaration of Independence and became the Governor of Connecticut. Huntington was named after him in 1789.

In December of 1895 the church bell was dedicated. It was given by Mrs. Henry H. Clark in honor of Mr. Charles Curtis. The bell was donated to ring to call parish members to worship, to announce the bridal parties pledging their troth and to toll for the deceased. This is the same bell we currently ring today.
